Overview

This conference presents topics of interest to pediatric, family practice and infectious diseases clinicians, as well as other health professionals. Objectives

- Describe basic principles and the CDC guidance on outpatient antimicrobial stewardship.
- Review dermatologic manifestations of pediatric infectious diseases.
- Discuss the epidemiology, clinical manifestations, prevention and treatment of SARS-CoV-2/COVID-19.
