A Tribute



L. Joseph Butterfield, MD October 5, 1926 - June 1, 1999

Dr. Butterfield, a world-renowned neonatology pioneer, visionary and master of networking, created the Newborn Center (Neonatal ICU) at Children's Hospital Colorado in 1965. He designed a regionalized system of care, "Newborn Country USA", advocated for newborns and

their families in legislative and professional arenas, and endowed the L. Joseph Butterfield Chair in Pediatrics at Children's Hospital Colorado.
