## Overview

This course is designed for pediatric surgeons, urologists, gynecologists and gastroenterologists, as well as advanced practice providers and pediatric nurses managing patients with colorectal and urogenital conditions.

This course will show previously recorded and/or live video operative demonstrations, what we believe are the most important surgical/technical maneuvers to be performed during the repair of anorectal malformations and hirschsprung disease.

### Learner Outcome

Participants will report increased knowledge of pertinent clinical conditions of pediatric patients with anorectal malformation and hirschsprung disease.

## Objectives

- Review the principles of diagnosis and management of anorectal malformations
- Describe the diagnosis of hirschsprung disease and idiopathic constipation and the difference in their management
- Explain the principles of treatment of hirschsprung disease and related disorders
- Discuss the challenges of short-and long-term postoperative care
- Recognize indications for reoperative surgery
- Discuss management of associated urologic and gynecologic problems
- Review the comprehensive management approach to cloacal exstrophy
- Outline the use of the posterior sagittal approach for a variety of conditions
- Learn how to do bowel management for constipation and fecal incontinence

This four-day intensive teaching course will examine the surgical treatment and management of pediatric colorectal and urogenital surgical problems, including:

- Surgical demonstrations and discussion with faculty experts
- Methods of evaluation of surgical techniques
- Anorectal malformations
- Cloacal malformations
- Cloacal exstrophy
- Prognosis of these deformities
- Hirschsprung disease
- Idiopathic constipation
- Fecal incontinence
