Beverly Malone, PhD, RN, FAAN, is the CEO of the National League of Nursing, past president of the American Nurses Association and the first African American general secretary of the Royal College of Nursing. Malone is a vocal advocate speaking to the role that nursing plays in ensuring access to safe, quality, culturally competent care to diverse patient populations, both domestically and globally. She received a bachelor's degree in nursing from the University of Cincinnati, a master's degree in adult psychiatric nursing from Rutgers University, and a doctoral degree in clinical psychology from Wayne State University.

Dr. Malone will discuss how all nurses are leaders regardless of job title and how nurses can find the way as leaders through engagement and core values. She will also address the responsibility that comes with the power of nursing and how to utilize different types of power at different times to elicit different outcomes. Lastly, Dr. Malone will engage in conversation about the current political environment and how nurses can navigate patient care during these challenging times. All nurses, nurse leaders and other clinical team members are invited to attend. After attending this event, the participant will report increased knowledge on ways to build leadership skills, how to use their power as a nurse to move themselves and others, and how to deliver the best patient care in a difficult political climate.
