It is essential that healthcare providers are aware of the latest research and evidence-based practice to provide optimal care. This conference will emphasize an integrated approach to care among family, community, and healthcare teams through case-based presentations, thought-provoking discussions, and an optional afternoon session focused on mental health training.

Target audience includes: Pediatric nurses, advanced practice providers, therapists, social workers, mental health counselors, care coordinators, case managers, child care providers, teachers and others assisting children and their families with healthcare needs in hospital, ambulatory, telephone triage, community health, public health, school, child care, and home settings.

At the end of this program, participants will be able to self-report expanded knowledge of complex healthcare issues impacting care providers, children, and families and available resources to support care of providers, children, and families.

Nursing

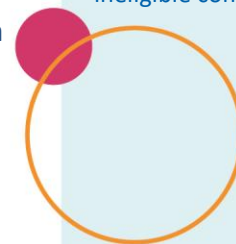

- How to Question, Persuade, and Refer someone who may be suicidal
- How to get help for yourself or learn more about preventing suicide
- Common causes of suicidal behavior
- Warning signs of suicide
- How to help someone in crisis
