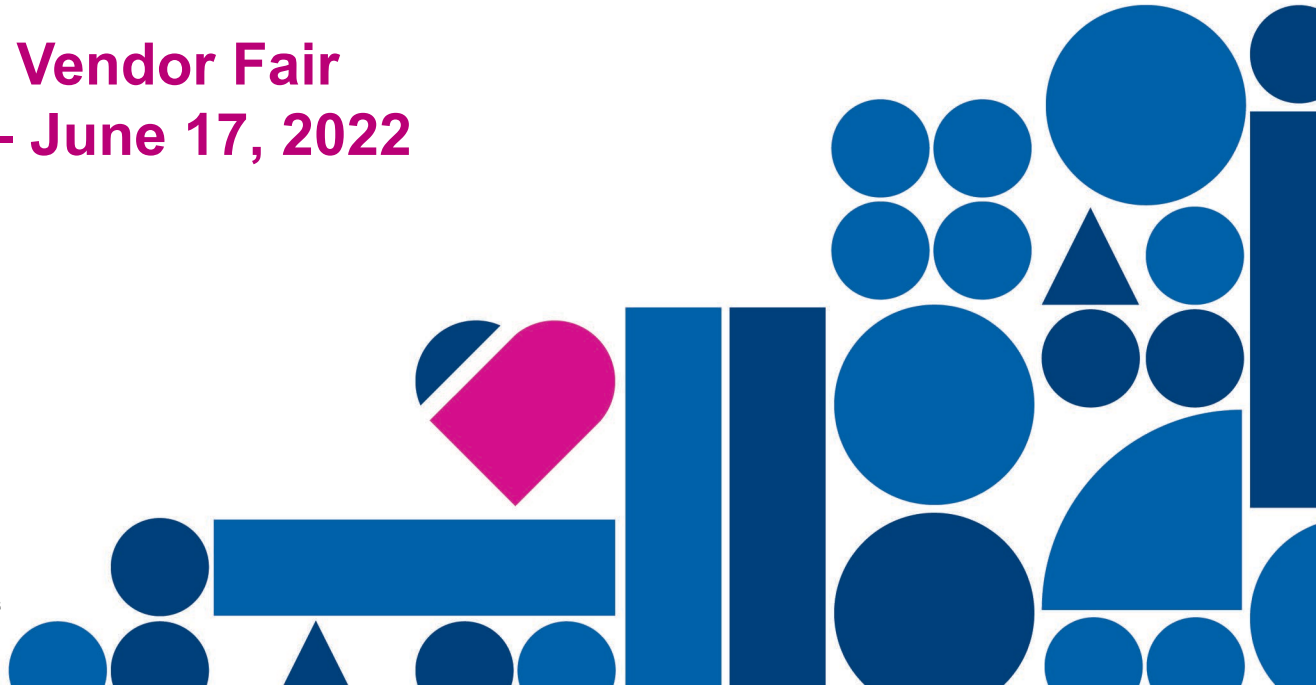

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Helpful tips –

Students with Down syndrome may:

1. Need to go to school nurse for medications when necessary
2. Have behavior issues because of communication barriers and delayed processing
3. Need information in a clear and concise manner while utilizing visuals (stock photos). Receptive language is often greater than expressive language.
4. Have scrapes or cuts that need Band-Aids. Band-Aides can sometimes be scary or stimulate sensory issues
