

If the G-Tube Comes Out the First 8 weeks

1. Wash your hands



2. Supplies: lubricating jelly, tape, and a Foley catheter or the G-tube with the balloon deflated





3. Put lubricating jelly on the end of the G-tube and gently insert it through the hole






Secure it with tape. DO NOT INFLATE THE BALLOON OR USE THE TUBE! Go to the emergency room or call your child's doctor



4. Or you can insert a Foley catheter.




5. Secure it with tape



6. Kink or clamp the Foley so it doesn't leak. DO NOT USE THE TUBE! Go to the emergency room or call your child's doctor.






Cleaning and Dressing a G-Tube


1. Wash hands and remove the old dressing





2. Collect supplies





- 3. Clean daily or when dressing is wet or dirty:
 - Hold the G-tube still and use a Q-tip or wash cloth to wipe around the insertion site with soap and water
 - Dry the site completely
 - Use the tic-tac-toe dressing for at least the first 8 weeks







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
