Mental Health Trauma and Resiliency in EMS: An Evolving Crisis is a day of live learning offered as part of the 49th Annual Colorado State EMS Conference.

Overview and Target Audience

A strong link is known to exist between high levels of chronic, critical incident stress and PTSD, depression, and drug or alcohol use. It is not surprising, then, that EMS professionals suffer a published risk of depression more than 6-7 times the national average and a more than doubled incidence of PTSD. Even more frighteningly, those serving in the prehospital field commit suicide at 12-15 times the national average.

While mental health has long been a smoldering catastrophe for EMS professionals, the past year has accelerated the urgency with which the EMS community must address this ongoing mental health crisis within the profession. EMS Medical Directors and agency leaders must gain a better understanding of the impact of this crisis, how to recognize early signs of mental health trauma, and how to help providers in crisis before these frontline care providers become another statistic.
